The Journal of Transnational American Studies (JTAS) invites submissions for individual articles and special fora.

The Journal of Transnational American Studies (JTAS) is an open-access, peer-reviewed forum for Americanists in the global academic community.

Moving beyond disciplinary and geographic boundaries that might confine the field of American Studies, *JTAS* is an established critical conduit that publishes innovative transnational work in order to facilitate the broadest possible cultural conversation about Transnational American Studies. The journal is available without cost to anyone with access to the Internet.

Exploring the “transnational turn” called for by Shelley Fisher Fishkin that has pushed the boundaries of post-exceptional American Studies, *JTAS* welcomes original articles as well as collected essays on a theme—a “Special Forum”—that critically engage new research questions and the growing conceptual terrain of the field we have helped to establish: Transnational American Studies. Interdisciplinary research of interest to the journal may include: archipelagic relations; environment; Asian/American, migration and Latinx borderland studies; remapping Indigenous Studies; the Black Atlantic; historiographies of revolutionary solidarity work across continents; performative practices of transculturation and intercultural; literary, artistic, and theoretical analyses.

Submissions of individual essays and proposals to guest edit a Special Forum are accepted on a rolling basis. All manuscripts submitted for publication in the “Articles” section or the “Special Forum” section undergo a double blind peer review by a minimum of two external reviewers and by the members of the *JTAS* editorial board.

JTAS is non-fee, non-commercial, free to authors and to readers. We have no submission charges or article processing charges (APC), and all published articles are freely available to readers.

JTAS is published by eScholarship: Open Access Publications from the University of California. eScholarship offers statistical services for individual articles and all issues on a monthly basis as well as access to all past issues in the archives. The Library of Congress has selected *JTAS* for permanent inclusion in its archive of electronic publications.

Authors retain copyright for all content published in the *Journal of Transnational American Studies*. However, authors grant to the journal the right to publish the article under a Creative Commons Attribution ([CC BY-NC-ND 4.0](https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nc-nd/4.0/)) license and to make available such content, in any format, in perpetuity.
