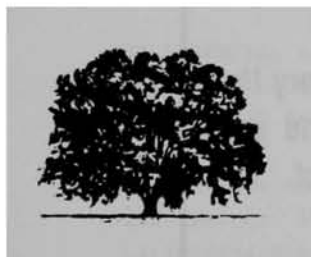

THIS MONOGRAPH DESCRIBES AND DEMARCATES LATE PREHISTORIC AND EARLY HISTORIC TERRITORIAL BOUNDARIES OF THE PLAINS MIWOK AND ADJACENT GROUPS WHO ONCE RESIDED IN THE SACRAMENTO DELTA AREA OF CENTRAL CALIFORNIA. THROUGH METICULOUS ANALYSIS OF EARLY EXPLORATION DIARIES, SPANISH MISSION RECORDS AND MAPS, THE SUTTER DOCUMENTS, REMINISCENCES, AND ETHNOGRAPHIC, LINGUISTIC AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL INFORMATION, THE AUTHOR PROPOSES THE FORMER EXISTENCE OF 28 INDEPENDENT PLAINS MIWOK TRIBELETS AS OF A.D. 1800. CAREFUL EXAMINATION OF THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL RECORD FURTHER SUGGESTED THAT LINGUISTIC BOUNDARIES COULD BE DRAWN WHICH COINCIDES WITH CULTURALLY DEFINED ARCHAEOLOGICAL DISTRICTS.

THE VOLUME CONTAINS SEVEN CHAPTERS: INTRODUCTION, GEOGRAPHIC SETTING, PLAINS MIWOK CULTURE, ETHNOGEOGRAPHY: PROBLEMS AND SOURCES, TRIBELETS AND VILLAGES, LINGUISTIC BOUNDARIES, AND CONCLUSIONS. ALSO INCLUDED ARE MAPS SHOWING PLAINS MIWOK BOUNDARIES AND SETTLEMENTS AS PLACED BY THE AUTHOR AND BY AN EARLY SPANISH EXPLORER IN 1824.

The assemblage is interpreted to represent the activities of a hunters' society whose uniquely fashioned animal figurines find their known parallels only in Utah, Nevada, and Arizona.
