## Announcement: The MacArthur & Wilson Award

The Board of Directors of the International Biogeography Society is pleased to announce that this award will be presented to Miguel Bastos Araújo at the society's biennial meeting in Miami, Florida, 10-12 January 2013. The award, which is sponsored by Frontiers of Biogeography, is being made for the first time at the Miami meeting. It recognizes an early-career individual (or alternatively a pair of collaborators) for a notable, innovative contribution to biogeography and is named in honor of Robert H. MacArthur and Edward O. Wilson. Miguel Araújo was nominated by two groups of IBS members for his work, with a wide range of collaborators globally, on the impacts of global change on species distributions and for his contribution to the conservation science literature. A fuller account of his work will feature in a future edition of Frontiers following the presentation of the award.
