## COMMUNITY INTERNSHIPS IN LATIN AMERICA (CILA)

CILA integrates internship work, field study and seminars for studying community participation for social change in Latin America. CILA compares philosophical and ideological perspectives of a variety of community agencies or groups working with or for low-income and other disenfranchised populations in Latin America. The internship experience is designed to expose students to varying approaches to participation for social change so they can apply their learning when making choices about local and global responsibilities in their own society.

Format: Community internships, internship seminar, lectures, seminar, field study in Spanish. Homestays with local families.  
Location: The program base is Bogotá, Colombia with Quito, Ecuador as the alternate. Change of program base is made as opportunities arise or conditions require.

## LITERATURE, IDEOLOGY AND SOCIETY IN LATIN AMERICA (LISLA)

LISLA assesses competing ideologies, theories and their application for interpreting both literature and social realities in Latin America. Theory-building is integrated with field study in Colombia and, for comparative perspectives, in Puerto Rico.

Format: Lectures, seminar, field study in Spanish. Homestays with local families.  
Location: The program base is Bogotá, Colombia with Quito, Ecuador as the alternate. Includes field study-travel in Guatemala and Ecuador or San Andres Island. Changes in program base and field study-travel location are made as opportunities arise or conditions require.

## SOUTH AMERICAN URBAN SEMESTER (SAUS)

SAUS studies Latin American development and urbanization with an emphasis on issues of inequality and social change. Analyses of competing theories of development are integrated with field study in Colombia and/or comparative perspectives, in Guatemala where the program begins.

Format: Lectures, seminar, field study in Spanish. Homestays with local families.  
Location: The program base is Bogotá, Colombia with Quito, Ecuador as the alternate. Includes field study-travel in Guatemala and Ecuador or San Andres Island. Changes in program base and field study-travel location are made as opportunities arise or conditions require.




