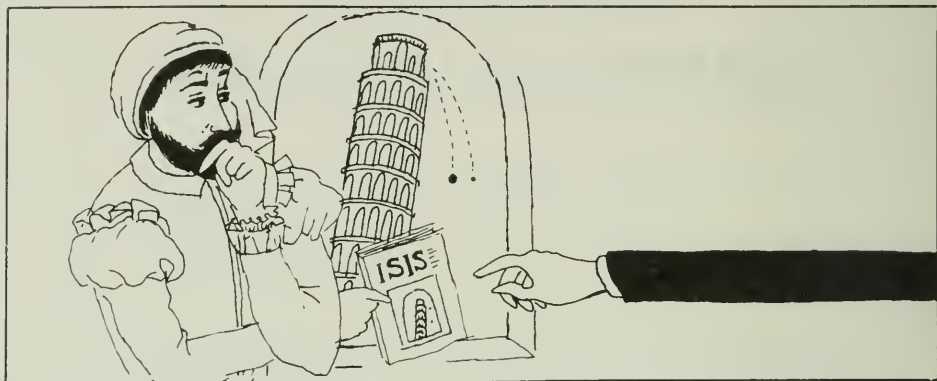

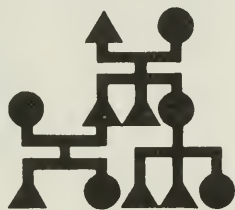

- review major scholarly works in Family History

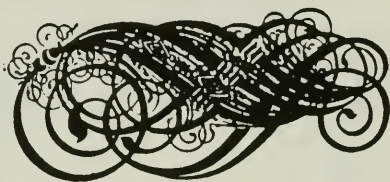

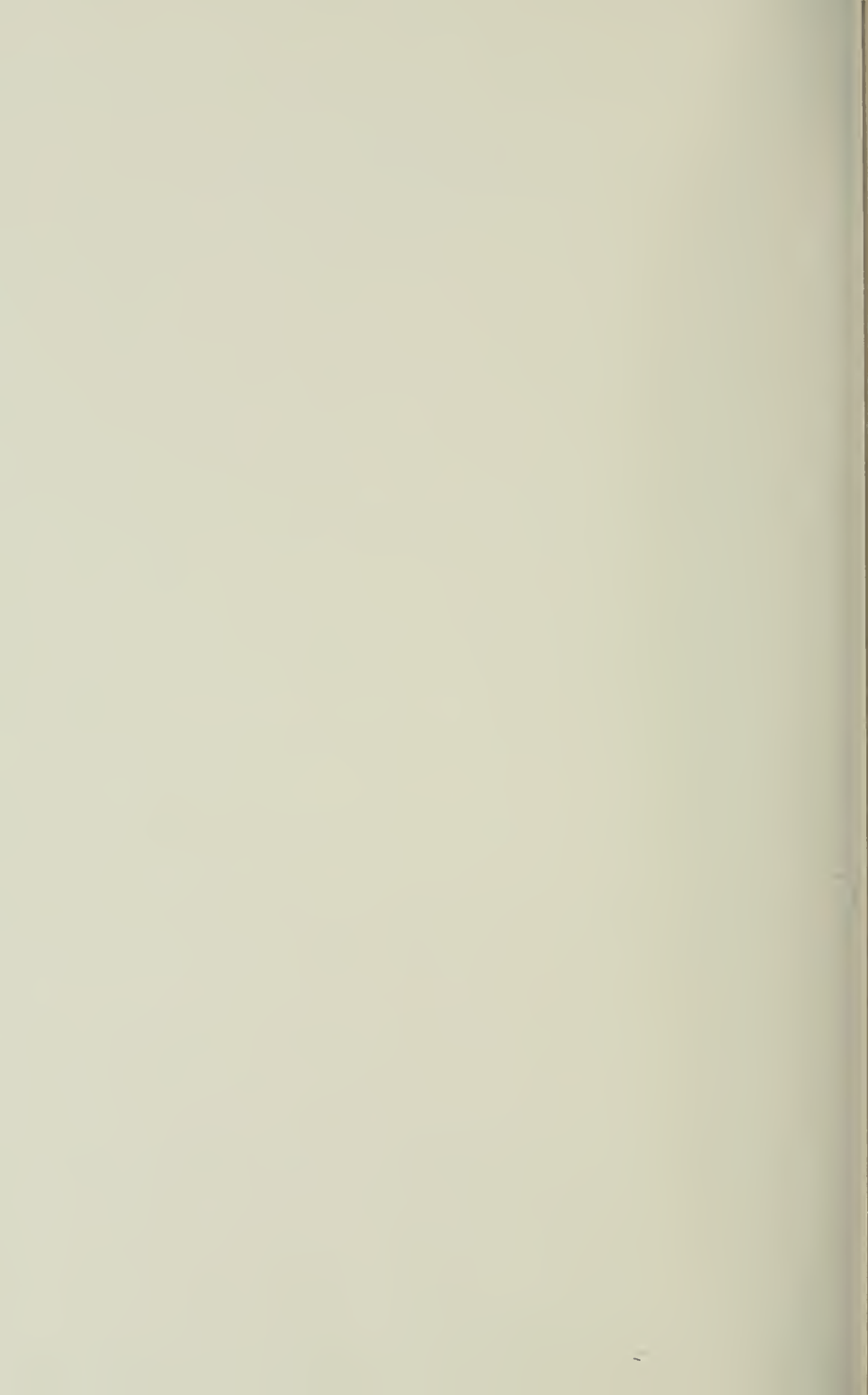
