PRESERVATION )) The Bancroft Library's Digital Collections Unit revived the Library's the Bencroff Library's Digital Collections Unit revived the Library's copy of an electronic literature clastic, Victory Gorden, from a twenty-five year old 3.5" floppy disk, performing digital forentics on the disk and working with Library IT to build a custom PC to house the work. At the same time library conservationists worked to safely install fragile and at-risk print works.
