## POLICY

The *Journal of California and Great Basin Anthropology* publishes original manuscripts on the ethnography, ethnohistory, languages, arts, archaeology, and prehistory of the native peoples of Alta and Baja California and the Great Basin. Five categories of written material are published: (1) articles, (2) reports, (3) documents, (4) comments, and (5) reviews. Provide *three* copies of all written material submitted for consideration. Manuscripts must be typewritten double-spaced throughout. Do not single-space *anything*, and do not use erasable bond paper. Keep manuscripts as brief as possible: articles (to 25 pages); reports and comments (under 10 pages); reviews (2-3 pages). Suggested page counts should include all illustrative material. Manuscripts submitted for consideration should conform strictly to the format of this issue. Authors may obtain a copy of the style guide by writing to the editor. Tables can ordinarily be set to type, but should be submitted double-spaced on one or more pages. Drawings and photographs should be of high quality. If possible, reduce drawings to conform with the single- or double-column format of the *Journal*, with ample room for captions. Submit captions on a separate page. References should be double-spaced and should conform to the style of this issue. End notes are permitted, but should be kept as brief as possible. All articles and reports submitted will be read by a committee of not less than four referees. Reprints cannot be made at a nominal cost by our printer, and it is no longer possible to make reprints in an economical manner through the editorial office of the *Journal*. Authors may, however, request and will receive permission to manufacture at their own expense up to 100 copies of each contribution published in the *Journal*. The *Journal* will provide, at no charge, tear sheets of an author's contribution for purposes of reprinting. Reprints may be given away or used as class hand-outs, but may not be sold.

## SUBSCRIPTIONS

The *Journal* is issued twice yearly, normally in summer and winter. Subscription rates are \$14.00 for individuals and \$17.00 for institutions, payable in U. S. currency. Henceforth, the *Journal of California and Great Basin Anthropology – Papers in Linguistics* will be issued on an occasional basis and will be announced in the *Journal*. Persons requesting back issues of the *Journal of California and Great Basin Anthropology*, the *Journal of California and Great Basin Anthropology – Papers in Linguistics*, or the *Journal of California Anthropology* should consult the editorial office for availability and cost.
