After publication, authors receive three complimentary copies of the issue in which their work appears. Please provide the complete title of your essay plus your name, address, e-mail address, phone number and academic affiliation on a separate sheet with your paper. Your name should not appear on the manuscript so that your contribution can be reviewed anonymously. Page numbering is important, please include.
